Helmets and goggles are provided with rentals.

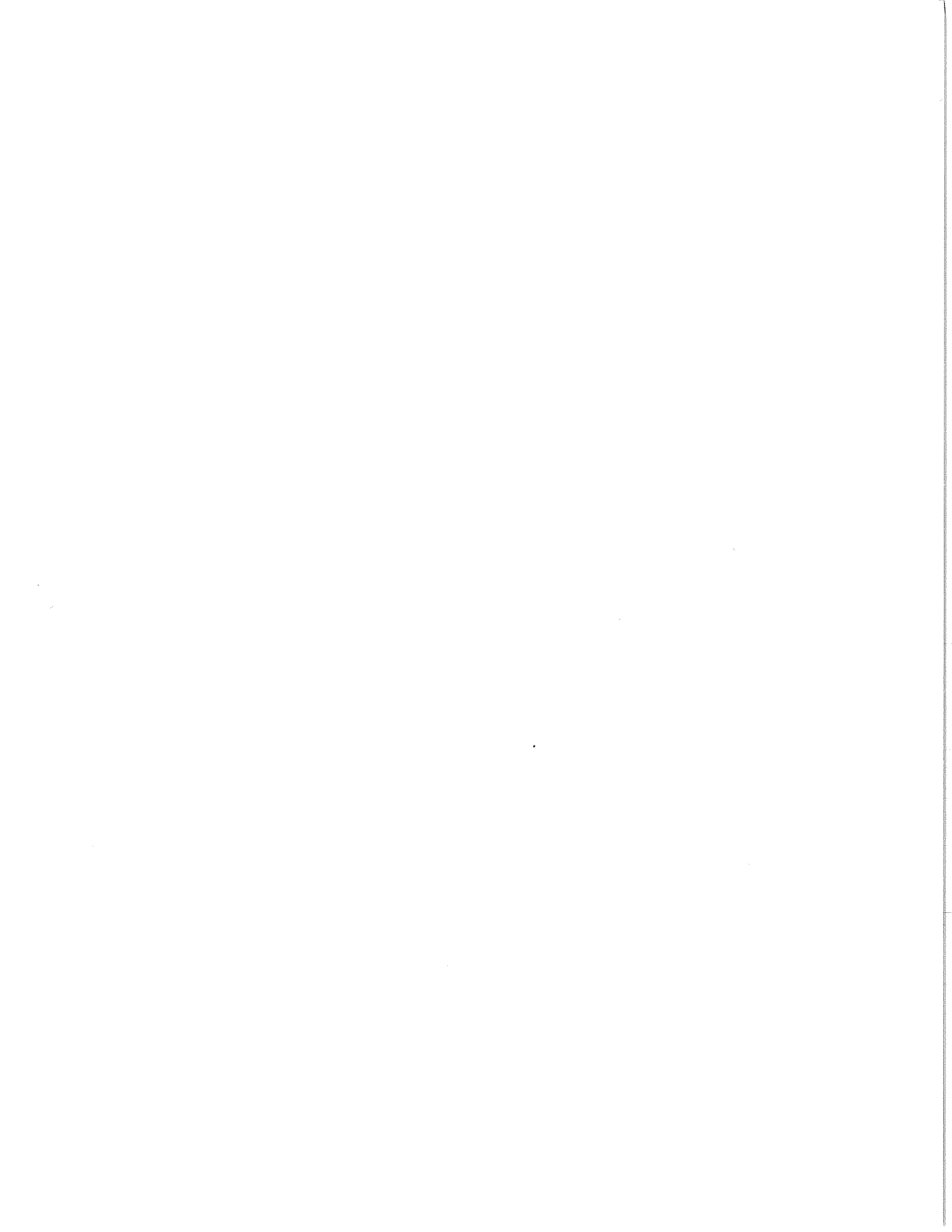

Goals of each level:

The goal of one level can be considered to be the entry requirement to the next level. A student needs to be able to demonstrate the goal consistently with appropriate speed for the conditions of the day.

Ability Level	Goal
Level 1 Ski	To turn both ways and stop; learning area.
Level 2 Ski	To control speed using turn shape on green (easiest) terrain.
Level 3 Ski	To ski in control in a wide parallel stance with poles on blue (intermediate/more difficult) runs.
Level 4 Ski	To improve edging while parallel skiing on black (advanced/most difficult) runs, in a variety of snow conditions.
Level 5 Ski	To improve edging, pressure control and timing and coordination in varied terrain and conditions. Use of green, blue and black runs.
Level 6 Ski	To continue to refine all skills in varied snow conditions, speed and terrain. Use of green, blue and black runs.

Level 1 Snowboard	To have good directional control while slide-slipping and traversing on both edges; learning area.
Level 2 Snowboard	To link turns on green (easiest) terrain.
Level 3 Snowboard	To vary turn shape and adapt to uneven terrain. Green and blue (intermediate/more difficult) runs.
Level 4 Snowboard	To ride confidently on all blue runs in a variety of snow conditions and terrain. Use of some black (advanced/most difficult) runs.
Level 5 Snowboard	To improve edging, pressure control and timing and coordination in varied terrain and conditions. Green, blue and black (advanced/most difficult) runs
Level 6 Snowboard	To continue to refine all skills in varied snow conditions, speed and terrain. Green blue and black runs.

WARNING

Under state law, the Holder of this pass assumes the risk of any injury to person or property resulting from any of the inherent dangers and risks of skiing and may not recover from the ski area operator and its employees for any injury resulting from any of the inherent dangers and risks of skiing. Inherent dangers of skiing include, but are not limited to: changing weather conditions; existing and changing snow conditions; bare spots; rocks; stumps; trees; collisions with natural objects, man-made objects, or other skiers; variations in terrain; and the failure of skiers to ski within their own abilities. Other risks include cliffs, extreme terrain, jumps, and freestyle terrain. Holder is responsible for having the physical dexterity to safely load, ride and unload the lifts and must control speed and course at all times. Holder understands that snowmobiles, snowcats, and snowmaking may be encountered at any time. Holder agrees to **ASSUME ALL RISKS**, inherent or otherwise. **HOLDER AGREES NOT TO SUE** and to hold the ski area and its employees harmless for claims to person or property. All claims will be governed by the law of the State or Province where the ski area is located and exclusive jurisdiction rests courts of that State or Province.

Holder agrees to comply with the verbal instructions of ski area personnel and all posted signs, to remain alert to all hazards, and to act in a careful and prudent manner at all times. Ski area personnel may revoke Holder's access to the ski area if Holder engages in conduct that is improper, dangerous, or constitutes fraud or nuisance.
